Tuesday, August 12, 2020: RT 25 Southbound near Exit 9 in Monroe/Trumbull CT

- Due to construction, there was only one lane open
- Driving at about 10-15 MPH the car stalled and I moved it slightly aside to keep the lane open
- Steam was coming from the engine and liquid (I think anti-freeze) was leaking out
- Then I noticed a reflection of a flame on the anti-freeze and smoke started to come out of the engine
- The smoke turned to fire

I loved the 718 and wondered about getting on the allocation list for a 718 GTS4. Now, I am not sure. And my wife is terrified.

Finally, I am still in love with Porsche and realize that my experience is unique for the brand. That said, I write to see if you can be of any help in replacing my car and would appreciate any consideration.
