The interior portion of this interior piece has been degrading and crumbling over time. It makes a particular mess when I remove it getting all into and somewhat staining my linen carpet. Also I'm not wild about it crumbling into and around the electronics. I sought to "seal" or arrest this peeling/crumbling and thought I'd use Loctite Adhesive Spray.

This whole operation (after piece was out of car) took all of 15 min, plus 15 min dry time.

\*In the end, using the Loctite Adhesive Spray this was probably not the best product for the application I ended up with, but you can potentially improve upon it by perhaps using a rubberized product in aerosol form.

## This is the piece (L) as removed before starting:





First, I taped if off with wide blue painter's tape (R) to avoid overspray on carpet. I wanted to loosen the flaking pieces off before I sprayed it. I tried a Teri-cloth towel- just flaked more up. Tried vacuum with small attachment- still *no joy*.

THEN I tried loops of the painter's tape and rolled it on. This did the trick big time- it took if off effortlessly and absolutely cleanly within 5 minutes max.







THEN my thought was "Well, the spray-on Loctite adhesive I was planning to use is no longer going to be stabilizing the peeling etc since it's all been cleanly removed". WELL, I was too lazy to go back to Home Depot, so I hit it with a heavy coat of the Loctite Adhesive spray anyway.

I then quickly removed the painter's tape as soon as I was done spraying to avoid bonding to it as well as the interior piece





<- It was dry in 15 min- not tacky at all, and also very pliable.

(I may still hit with a coat of some rubberized /insulating product)
