Emergency Frunk Release

While I had the front end of my car torn apart today to install my center radiator I spent some time studying the emergency frunk release that goes to the left side wheel well. I thought I'd see if I could extend it somehow to a more convenient location.

Franky, after looking at this mysterious cable, I cant even understand how it works. Attached are photos I took showing where it connects inside the trunk (on the outside of a shielded cable), how it runs through the trunk, and what it looks like behind the fender liner. I've seen other pictures of the cable inside the fender well and it either had a hook or a loop to pull on. Mine has neither! I tried pulling on the wire and was

afraid I'd break something, because it's just pulls against the outside shield on the main release cable.

How can this possibly work? I gave up on my idea but if anyone has more insight please chime in.





Plus, doesn't that render the tow hook unusable for i.e., pulling the car from a snowbank, ditch, etc?

We don't have any thieves on our forum, maybe a few malcontents but certainly no thieves. I live in a gated community of 62+ that has a security patrol so I doubt many of them could get off their walkers or canes long enough to try and remove the tow cover, they'd have to stop and change their Depends. I also doubt any thief would even know there is a cable to open the frunk on a Boxster and if they do figure it out there is nothing much in there for them to steal. The tow hook screws right in and when I'm done I've got a little hook I fashioned from a clothes hanger that I fish it back out with. Much more convenient than tearing out the wheel liner to get at it.


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
